THEY HAD TO DRAG MY SON to the car," Madison* remembered. "Jake* was screaming, begging not to go."

That moment shattered Madison. She was trying to hold her life together — working two jobs, walking everywhere with her young son because they didn't have a car, and living in a garage barely fit for human habitation.

With no affordable childcare and the afterschool program full, Madison decided she had no choice but to leave Jake, age 7, home alone while she worked. Many days he missed school.

One morning, a knock on the door changed everything. CPS and the sheriff arrived after a neighbor's report.

Madison was given a chance to prove herself — walking Jake to school, asking friends for help and trying to find after-school care. But with rent due, she sometimes decided to sneak out the back to work, leaving Jake alone.

Two weeks later, CPS returned unannounced — and took Jake away.

You opened the door when no one else would.

Soon after, Madison's landlady evicted her, afraid of CPS involvement.

Homeless, Madison searched for shelters but found none that accepted mothers with children — until she found Shepherd's Gate.

"They said I could come — and that Jake could join me," Madison said. "They gave me clean clothes, a warm meal. I hadn't felt that kind of care in a long time."

"I planned to stay just 90 days to get Jake back," she said. But Shepherd's Gate became more than a shelter — it became a place of healing.

Because of you, healing began.

Madison started therapy to face the pain of a violent assault and her childhood trauma.

A few weeks later, thanks to Shepherd's Gate's support and work with CPS, Jake was reunited with his mom.

But healing took time. Jake was angry and scared. "He didn't think I was coming back," Madison said. "He thought I didn't love him."

You didn't just help Madison — you helped Jake too.

With therapy and love, Jake began to heal. "The staff was so patient with him — they understood it was trauma, and he received therapy too," said Madison.

"I'm proud of him," Madison said. "And proud of myself."

Today, Madison and Jake are still at Shepherd's Gate. She's rebuilding her life and faith. For the first time, she believes she and Jake are truly on the right path.


