Just Trying to be a Kid

LAST CHRISTMAS, Santa Claus came to the big Christmas celebration at Shepherd's Gate. All of the kids were so excited to see him. They couldn't wait to hug Santa and tell them what they wanted for Christmas.

Except for Vicki^{*}.

Vicki couldn't even stay in the room. Everything was too much for her: the noise, the activity, the amount of people. She left the room in tears.

Vicki isn't like other kids. She has mental health diagnoses, but she also carries scars from being homeless. Before she and her family came to Shepherd's Gate

... they lived in their car for a year. That trauma made it harder for her and her family to get the care Vicki needed. But friends like you changed that.

Vicki and her family came to Shepherd's Gate last year. While her mom completed her recovery program, Vicki was able to see a psychologist who helped find the right medications for her. And Vicki was able to receive counseling to help her process everything that happened.

By the time the graduation party came around last spring, Vicki was able to celebrate with everyone and not feel overwhelmed.

Learning to Trust Her Mom

If you ask most kids who they trust the most, they'll usually answer their mom or dad. But Hannah* didn't trust her mom for a long time.

Before they came to Shepherd's Gate, Hannah went through traumatic situations and witnessed her mom's abuse. She felt scared and worried that her mom couldn't protect her. She didn't trust her mom to make the right choices.

Thankfully, through the counseling she received here, Hannah was able to forgive her mom. She's learning to trust her mom again. The reunification program is helping them heal and restore their relationship. It's one of our most important programs being so many of our children come from foster care situations.

Your prayers and support help kids like Vicki and Hannah heal and feel like a kid again!

'H' is for Hands . . . Not Hitting

There are probably many preschools teaching toddlers that hands are for sharing, not hitting. But that lesson lands differently when you know the toddler has seen their dad hit their mom.

Most of the kids at Shepherd's Gate are traumatized by life. They've experienced and seen things no child should have to go through. That means they need a different type of care than other kids do. That's why we have the "Whole Child" program here. (*Read more about* our "Whole Child" program on our website at shepherdsgate.org/children) Children like Vicki and Hannah need access to professional counseling and other therapies to help them process what they've been through. They're often behind their classmates at school or behind developmentally. The whole child focus makes sure they get help for every aspect of their well-being.

Through your partnership, these kids can heal and have a childhood.

For some of the women and children here, this may be the first happy and safe Christmas they've ever experienced. For others, it may be the first Christmas since being reunited as a family. That's why we do everything we can to help them have a joyful, memorable Christmas.

During the holidays, we plan a cookie decorating day with the kids, a gift-wrapping party for the moms and a big Christmas party with carols, games and snacks. There are also big dinners, breakfast with Santa, Alumni celebrations and intimate gatherings to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
