"Please, I need help."

Her story actually began here in the Bay Area. After an abusive childhood, Joan turned to drugs as a young woman to numb the pain. Her addiction quickly took over and grew out of control.

Eventually, she met a man who promised to take care of her.

He didn't.

He was a sex trafficker.

He used guns and drugs to trap her and wouldn't let her leave. He sold Joan's body every day in Oakland. But her situation was about to get even worse . . .

The man who trafficked Joan sold her to a new trafficker, who was even more violent. He moved her to the east coast and forced her to work. He threatened to kill her if she ever tried to run away. His mom would lock Joan in a room to keep her from leaving.

Joan remembered that her aunt had found help at Shepherd's Gate several years before. She thought if her aunt had been able to change her life, maybe Joan could too. When she got finally got her hands on a phone, Joan reached out to us.

Even though she was across the country, our case managers helped Joan create a plan so she could safely escape and get to California and Shepherd's Gate.

Here, thanks to friends like you, Joan was able to feel safe for the first time in years. She is looking forward to gaining life- and job-skills so she can build a better future for her and her daughter. She's receiving specialized therapy to help her overcome the shame and trauma.

But most amazing of all, Joan is living a new life in Christ. She was baptized in the Lord and knows that He is the only one who can truly change her life.
